- Build an expert teaching team with a focus on the delivery of the Australian Curriculum with appropriate adjustments in One School and evidenced in classrooms for all students identified on NCCD.
- Maintain or improve at least a year's academic growth in a school year for English,
 Mathematics and Science for 96% of students.
- Close the achievement gap of Students with Disabilities in English from 58% to 30%
- Close the achievement gap in English for IEALD learners from 18% to 10%, and for Mathematics from 10% to 5%.

Our initiatives include

- Employing a Head of Department (HOD) Curriculum to support teachers in co-planning, delivering, assessing and reporting on the Australian Curriculum.
- Conducting learning walks and providing feedback to staff and students on curriculum goals.
- Building a deep understanding of the Australian Curriculum for all teaching staff supported by our HOD in weekly Intentional Collaboration time.
- Developing staff knowledge of differentiation within the curriculum during. Intentional Collaboration time
- Planning for differentiation of curriculum to ensure every child is receiving their curriculum entitlement.
